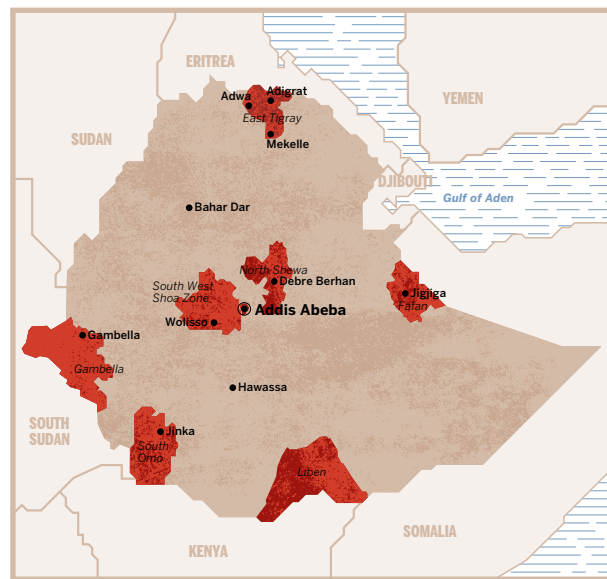

Antenatal and postnatal care visits, access to safe delivery and to mother waiting house are guaranteed, along with malnutrition unit, therapeutic feeding unit and neonatal

Other hospital services

Emergency, out-patients and in-patients, diagnostics, chronic diseases, HIV, Tb, surgery, orthopaedics and ophthalmology

Maternity and paediatrics

At Jinka General hospital and Turmi Health center, healthcare services for newborn and children under 5 are ensured, including nutrition and early childhood development.

The paediatric intensive care unit was started up.

Food and drugs distribution to drought affected communities in Hammer and Dasenech districts.

Refugees
